




# Safety precautions

Avoid using your mobile phone in areas where it may cause interference or present a hazard. Follow local laws and regulations.



Follow any rules or regulations in hospitals and health care facilities. Power off your phone near any medical apparatus.

Power off your phone in an aircraft. The phone may interfere with the aircraft's control equipment and navigation system.

Power off your phone near high-precision electronic devices. The phone may affect the performance of these devices.

Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories. Only qualified personnel are allowed to service or repair the phone.

Do not place your phone or its accessories in containers with a strong electromagnetic field.

Do not place magnetic storage media near your phone. Radio waves from the phone may erase the information stored on them.

Use only approved batteries and chargers to avoid the risk of explosions.





Do not block the area around the ambient light and proximity sensor. When you attach a protective film to the screen, make sure it does not block the sensor.




# Inserting a micro-SIM card

Don't insert the micro-SIM card when your phone is powered on.


1. Open the battery cover.



**2.** Insert the micro-SIM card. Make sure the gold contact area and beveled edge of the card are facing the right directions.




**3.** Close the battery cover.



# Removing a micro-SIM card

Don't remove the micro-SIM card when your phone is powered on.

- 1. Open the battery cover.
- 2. Take out the micro-SIM card.




# Inserting a microSD card

You can expand your phone's storage capacity with a microSD card.


- **1.** Open the battery cover.
- 2. Open the microSD card cover.



**3.** Place the microSD card into the card slot.



4. Fasten the microSD card cover.



# Removing a microSD card



⚠ Uninstall the microSD card before you remove it; otherwise, the microSD card may be damaged.


- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **More**... > **Storage**.
- 3. Touch Unmount SD card.
- **4.** Flip the microSD card cover open.
- **5.** Carefully take out the microSD card.

# Charging the battery



Your phone's built-in battery is not user-removable. To replace the battery, contact an authorized service center. Do not attempt to remove it yourself.

Use the provided USB cable and power adapter to connect your phone to a power socket.



# **Battery indicator**

The battery indicator shows your phone's battery level.

- Blinking red: The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is higher than 10%.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost or already full.



1 If the battery temperature is too high, your device will reduce the charging capacity to protect the battery.

## Important information about the battery

- Rechargeable batteries have a limited lifecycle and may eventually need to be replaced. If you notice significantly reduced battery life, replace the battery. Your phone's built-in battery is not user-removable. To replace the battery, contact an authorized service center. Do not attempt to remove it vourself.
- If your phone has been running for long periods of time, especially in hot environments, heat may be pushed to the surface of the phone. If your phone is overheating, cease using it immediately and unplug it from any power source to let it cool down. Do not hold on to the phone for too long to avoid burn injuries.
- Use the original battery, power adapter, and USB cable to charge your phone. Using third-party accessories may reduce your phone performance or pose security risks. When your phone is charging, do not operate it or cover the phone or power adapter with any object.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and age of the battery.
- If your phone is very low on power, it plays an alert tone and displays a message. If the battery level is extremely low, your phone automatically powers off.

If the battery power is depleted, you may not be able to power on your
phone immediately after you begin charging the battery. This is normal.
Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes before attempting to power
on your phone.

# Powering on or off your phone

- To power on your phone, press and hold the power button.
- To power off your phone, press and hold the power button to display an option menu, and then touch Power off > OK.
- if you are experiencing slowdown issues or the system doesn't respond or can't be properly powered off, press and hold the power button for 10 seconds or more to restart your phone.

# Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen not only prevents mistaken operations from occurring without your knowledge, but also protects your phone from unauthorized use. You can lock and unlock your screen in a number of different ways and also add lock screen widgets. The pre-installed screen unlock method is used as an example in this section.

# Locking the screen

- Method 1: Press the power button to manually lock the screen.
- Method 2: After being idle for a specified period of time, your phone automatically locks its screen.
- To set the screen lock method, touch on the home screen. On the displayed **General** tab, touch **Screen lock**.

# Unlocking the screen

- **1.** If the screen is off, press **U** to turn it on.
- 2. Drag toward to unlock the screen.



# **Touchscreen gestures**




**Touch**: Tap an item once. For example touch an application to select or open it.



**Touch and hold**: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more. For example, touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to display an option menu.



Flick: Move your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example, you can flick left or right across the notification panel to dismiss a notification. Flick vertically or horizontally to go to other home screens, scroll through a document, and more.




**Drag**: Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. For example, you can rearrange applications and widgets on the home screen this way.



**Spread apart and pinch together**: Spread two fingers apart to zoom in, and pinch them together to zoom out on a map, web page, or picture.

# Getting to know your home screen

Your home screens are where you'll find your favorite widgets and all your applications. We did away with the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications. The default home screen is shown below.



- Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Display area: displays application icons, folders, and widgets.
- Screen position indicator: shows the current screen's position.
- Dock: displays your most common applications.


# Switching between home screens

Running out of space on the home screen? Not to worry. Your phone lets you create more home screens for various applications and widgets.

• Flick left and right across the screen to switch between the home screens.



• Pinch two fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to enter that particular home screen.



# Taking a screenshot

Want to share an interesting scene in a movie or show off your new high score in a game? Take a screenshot and share away.

Press the power and volume down buttons simultaneously to take a screenshot. Then, open the notification panel and touch  $\leq$  to share the screenshot. By default, screenshots are saved to the **Pictures** folder in **File Manager**.

You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and touch > 1 to take a screenshot.


## Auto-rotate screen

Your phone features a tilt sensor. If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, your screen automatically changes between landscape and portrait view. You'll also be able to enjoy tilt sensor-based applications, such as racing games.

To turn on or off the auto-rotate screen function, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, and touch  $\bigcirc$ .

## Using the notification panel

Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.



- 1 Touch = to delete all notifications.
- 2 Touch to display the settings screen.
- Touch the switch shortcuts on the notification panel to turn on or off the functions.
- Touch an application to start it and flick left or right across a notification to dismiss it.

# Organizing applications and widgets on the home screen

# Adding a widget to the home screen

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Widgets.
- **3.** Drag a widget from the screen's lower section to a screen thumbnail.
- **4.** Touch **⇔** to return to the home screen.
- i) If the home screen doesn't have enough space, your phone will automatically create a new home screen to the right-hand side of the original and place the widget on the new home screen. You can have nine home screens at most.

# Moving an application or widget

On the home screen, touch and hold an application or widget until the phone vibrates to enter editing mode. You can then drag an application or widget to any fitting empty space.

# Deleting an application or widget

On the home screen, touch and hold the application or widget you want to delete until a is displayed. Drag the unwanted application or widget to to delete it.

i Deleting an application icon uninstalls the application. When you delete an application icon, your phone prompts you to confirm the action.

Touch **OK** to uninstall the application. Some pre-installed applications cannot be uninstalled.

## Organizing home screen icons using folders

- **1.** On the home screen, drag an item onto another one to create a folder containing both of them.
- 2. Touch the folder to open it. You can then:
  - Touch the folder name to rename it.
  - Touch + and add more items to the folder.
  - Drag an icon out from the folder to remove the icon.
- A folder must contain at least two items; otherwise, the folder will automatically disappear.

# Moving a home screen

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.

- **3.** Touch and hold a home screen thumbnail until your phone vibrates, and drag it to the new location.

## Deleting a home screen

- **1.** On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home** screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- **3.** Touch  $\times$  in the upper right corner of the screen to delete it.

# **Accessing applications**

# **Application overview**

Your phone comes with the following applications:



**Themes**: Change the theme.



**Phone**: Make and answer calls. Your phone supports smart dialing and dialing from your contact list or call log.



**People**: Manage phone numbers, email addresses, and other contact details. You can import contacts from your old phone.



**Messaging**: Send or receive text messages and multimedia messages.



**Browser**: Browse web pages and manage your bookmarks.



**Email**: Send or receive emails, and synchronize email accounts.



Camera: Take photos or shoot videos.



Gallery: Browse, manage, or edit photos.



**DLNA**: Share media files between devices on the same Wi-Fi network. Push multimedia files on your phone to other devices and control the playback.



**File Manager**: Manage files and applications on your phone.



**App Installer**: View applications not yet installed on your phone and install them.



Backup: Back up your phone data to prevent data loss.



Calendar: Manage your personal and work lives on schedule.



**Clock**: Add alarms, view world times, and use timers and stopwatches.



**Weather**: View weather information for cities around the world.



**Calculator**: Make basic algorithmic calculations in both basic and scientific calculator modes.



**Notes**: Record your thoughts and other useful information.



FM Radio: Listen to the FM radio.



**Settings**: Configure your phone settings.

## Starting applications and switching between them

On the home screen, touch an application icon to open it.

To switch to another application, touch to return to the home screen, and touch the icon of the application you want to open.

# Viewing recently used applications

Touch and hold **to** display the list of recently used applications. You can then:

- Touch an application to start it.
- Flick left or right across an application or touch X on its right upper corner to dismiss it.
- Touch  $\hbar$  to clear the list.


# **Texting**

Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can quickly enter text using the onscreen keyboard.

- Touch a text box to bring up the onscreen keyboard.
- To hide the onscreen keyboard, touch  $\hookrightarrow$ .


## Huawei input method

Drag your finger left or right across the onscreen keyboard to switch between the QWERTY and 9-key keyboards.



- Touch to switch between lowercase letters, uppercase letters, and caps lock.
- 2 Touch \*#12 to enter numbers and symbols.
- 3 Touch to enter emoticons.
- 4 Touch to switch the input language.
- 5 Touch to switch between the QWERTY and 9-key keyboards.


## Android input method



- Touch 🔯 to switch between lowercase and uppercase letters.
  - Touch and hold or quickly touch  $\bigcirc$  twice to turn on caps lock.
- 2 Touch [123] to enter numbers and symbols.
- Touch to use voice input.
  - Touch and hold up to open the **Input options** menu.
- Touch \_\_\_\_\_to enter a space.
  - Touch and hold \_\_\_\_\_to choose another input method.
- Touch \_\_ to enter a period.
  - Touch and hold . to enter symbols.
    - Touch to delete the character to the left of the cursor.
- Touch and hold to quickly delete multiple characters to the left of the cursor.

# **Editing text**

Learn how to select, cut, copy, and paste text on your phone.



- Select text: Touch and hold the text to bring up
   Then drag
   and
   to select more or less text, or touch
   Select all to select all text in a text box.
- Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- Paste text: Touch where you want to insert the text, drag to move the insertion point, and touch Paste to paste the text you copied or cut.



# Configuring an input method

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Language & input.
- **3.** Under **KEYBOARD & INPUT METHODS**, touch an input method to configure it.

# Changing the home screen style

Your phone supports the standard and simple home screen styles.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch .
- 2. Under All, touch Home screen style.
- 3. Choose Simple or Standard and touch APPLY.

# Setting the theme

Your phone comes with a variety of themes.

# Changing the theme

- 2. Select a theme and touch APPLY.

# Customizing a theme

- 1. From the theme grid, touch CUSTOMIZE CURRENT THEME.
- 2. From the element list, choose the element you want to modify.

# Change the wallpaper

- On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- **3.** From the **Wallpaper** screen, you can set the following items:
  - Lock screen wallpaper: Set the wallpaper displayed on the phone lock screen.
  - Home screen wallpaper: Set the home screen wallpaper.

- **Shake to change**: Change the home screen wallpaper by shaking your phone.
- Random change: The home screen wallpaper changes randomly.

# Setting the home screen transition effect

- 1. On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home** screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Transitions.
- 3. Select a home screen transition effect.

# **Setting tones**

# Setting the ringtone

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (a) then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- **3.** Touch **Phone ringtone** and select either of the following options from the displayed dialog box:
  - Ringtone: choose from the default selection.
  - Music: choose from the audio files you have saved to your phone.
- 4. Touch Apply.

# Setting notification tones

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- 3. Touch Notification tone.
- 4. Select a tone type.
- i You can configure the email notification tone only after you have set up an email account.

- 5. Select a tone.
- 6. Touch Apply.

# Setting the screen unlock method

## Face unlock

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Face Unlock.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to take a photo of your face. Your phone will use face unlock as the primary unlock method.
- **5.** Set a secondary unlock method.

If face unlock cannot recognize you (dim light, for example), follow the onscreen instructions to unlock your phone using the secondary unlock method.

To turn off face unlock, use the secondary unlock method to enter the **Select** screen lock screen, and select another unlock method.

# Unlocking the screen with a pattern

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ( then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Pattern.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.
- i If you draw incorrect patterns five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

# Unlocking the screen with a PIN

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > PIN.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock PIN.

After a PIN is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

i If you enter incorrect PINs five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

## Unlocking the screen with a password

- 1. On the home screen, touch other the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Password.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock password.
- **5.** Repeat the password and touch **OK**.

After a password is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

if you enter incorrect passwords five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

# Customizing switch shortcuts on the notification panel

You can rearrange your switch shortcuts and move those you use most to top the list. Shortcuts on the top will be fully displayed on the notification panel.

- 1. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Flick left on the upper area. Touch to display the switch shortcut list.
- **3.** Drag a switch shortcut to a new position in the list.

# Changing the font size

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (a) then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.

# Adjusting the screen brightness

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. Touch Brightness.
- **4.** In the displayed dialog box, perform either of the following operations:
  - Select the Automatic brightness check box to have your phone automatically adjust its screen brightness based on the ambient light.
  - Drag the slider left to reduce the screen brightness or drag it right to increase the screen brightness.

You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and adjust the screen brightness using the switch shortcuts.

# **Smart dialing**

In addition to standard call procedures, smart dialing lets you quickly find contacts by entering parts of their names or numbers.


- **2.** Enter a phone number or the initials or first several letters of a contact name.

Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.

- **3.** From the list, select the contact you want to call.
- **4.** To end the call, touch ...

# Answering or rejecting a call

i When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.




- Drag right to answer the call.
- Drag left to reject the call.
- Drag Qup to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- On the dialer screen, touch > Call settings > Quick responses to edit the message that will be sent.

# Viewing the call log

- **1.** On the home screen, touch uto display your recent calls above the dialer.
- **2.** Touch > **Missed calls** to view your missed calls.

# What you can do during a call



- Touch : > | to place the current call on hold, and touch | again to resume the call.
- Touch > Co to start a three-way call. Before you use three-way calling, make sure you have subscribed to this service. For details, contact your service provider.
- **3** Touch **1** to use the speakerphone.
- **4** Touch **½** to mute or unmute the microphone.
- 5 Touch to end the call.
- **6** Touch **Ⅲ** to display the dialer.
- 7 Touch > to display a note.



Touch > \( \bigsize \) to display the contact list.

To return to the call screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, and touch **Current call**.

# Making a conference call

Conference calling with your friends, family, and co-workers is easy. Make or answer a call, and dial another number to add the second participant to your conference call.

- i Before you make a conference call, make sure you have subscribed to the service. For details, contact your service provider.
- 1. Call the first participant.
- 2. When the call is connected, touch > 6 to call the second participant.

  The first participant will be placed on hold.
- **3.** When the second call is connected, touch  $\hat{\lambda}$  to start a conference call.
- **4.** To add more people to the call, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- 5. Touch \_\_\_ to end the call.

# Answering a third-party call


Before you answer a third-party call, make sure you have turned on call waiting.

- **1.** If a call comes in when you are already in another call, drag right to answer the new call and place the first call on hold.
- **2.** To switch between the two calls, touch  $> \mathcal{C}$ .

# Making emergency calls

In the event of an emergency, you will still be able to make emergency calls without the use of a SIM card. However, you must still be under the coverage area.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ...
- 2. Enter your local emergency number and touch 📞 .



#### Other call services

Your phone also supports other call functions, such as call forwarding, call waiting, and voicemail. Before you use these functions, make sure you have subscribed to these services. For details, contact your service provider.

#### **Enabling call forwarding**

Too busy to answer all your calls with one phone? Forward them to another number and never miss an important call again!

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Call forwarding.
- **4.** Select a forwarding mode.
- **5.** Enter the phone number to which you want to forward calls, and touch **Enable**.

#### **Enabling call waiting**

The call waiting function lets you answer another incoming call when you are already busy in a call and switch between the two calls.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Additional settings.
- 4. Touch Call waiting to enable call waiting.

#### Setting up your voicemail

Voicemail is your personal storage for missed calls, including the calls missed when you are in another call or your phone is powered off.

- i Before you use voicemail, make sure you have subscribed to the voicemail service and obtained your voicemail number. For details, contact your service provider. You must also enable call forwarding and set all incoming calls to be forwarded to your voicemail.
- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Voicemail > Voicemail settings > Voicemail number.
- **4.** Enter your voicemail number, and touch **OK**.

To listen to your voicemail messages, touch and hold the **1** key on the dialer and follow the voice instructions.

# **People**

Forget about lugging around business card holders. You can now easily store and manage your contacts.

# Creating a contact

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **Contacts** tab.
- 2. Touch 💄.
- 3. Select an account.
- **4.** Enter the contact name, phone number, and other details. Touch **Add another field** to enter more information.
- **5.** Touch **DONE** to save the contact.

# Searching for a contact

- 1. On the home screen, touch let then the Contacts tab.
- 2. Touch the search box.
- Enter the contact name or initials.Matching results are displayed as you type.

For example, to search for John Doe, enter  ${\bf John\ Doe}$  or  ${\bf J\ D}.$ 

# **Copying contacts**

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **Contacts** tab.
- 2. Touch = > Manage contacts > Copy contacts.
- **3.** From the displayed option menu, select the location where the contacts you want to copy are saved.
- **4.** Touch the contacts you want to copy or touch **All** to select all contacts.

**5.** Touch **COPY** and select the account to which you want to paste the contacts.

# Importing or exporting contacts

Your phone supports contact files in .vcf format only. This is a standard format for files storing contacts. Contact names, addresses, phone numbers, and other information can be saved in .vcf files.

#### Importing contacts from a storage device

You can import contacts saved in a .vcf file from a storage device to your phone.



- **3.** Frame the scene you want to capture. The camera automatically focuses itself.

When the viewfinder frame turns green, the camera is focused.

4. Touch HDR.

#### Taking a panoramic photo

Are you still upset that your camera's view angle isn't wide enough to capture an incredible scene? Panorama mode is exactly the solution you need. You'll be able to piece together several photos and combine them into one seamless shot.

- 2. In photo mode, touch > to switch to panoramic mode.
- **3.** Frame the scene you want to capture.
- 4. Touch
- **5.** Move your phone slowly in the direction indicated by the arrow to capture multiple photos.
- if the viewfinder screen turns red, the view will not be captured. This may happen when you have moved your phone too fast or the viewfinder scope has gone beyond the limits of the panoramic view.
- **6.** Your phone stops shooting when it has taken enough photos for a panoramic photo. You can also touch to stop shooting.

  The camera automatically stitches the photos together to create one panoramic photograph.

#### Taking a photo using audio control



#### Mobile data connection

After you insert a SIM card into your phone and power it on for the first time, your phone automatically registers with your service provider's data service.

#### **Enabling the data service**

- When you don't need to access the Internet, disable the data service to save battery power and reduce data usage.

#### Creating an APN

The Access Point Name (APN) is a necessary parameter for a phone to connect to a mobile network or send multimedia messages. It is usually automatically set after you insert a SIM card into your phone. If your phone cannot connect to a mobile network using the automatically set APN, contact your service provider for the specific parameters and create a new APN.

- 2. Under All, touch Mobile networks.
- 3. Touch Access Point Names.
- 4. Touch > New APN.
- **5.** Enter the access point name and other parameters.
- 6. Touch ←
- in the APN list, touch > Reset to default to reset the APN information.

## Setting up a Wi-Fi connection

When you use your phone at home, you can connect to the Wi-Fi hotspot created from your router. Some public locations, such as airports and libraries, may also have Wi-Fi networks available for use.

#### Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Wi-Fi.
  You phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and displays them.
- **4.** Choose the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to and touch **Connect**. For an encrypted Wi-Fi network, enter the password when prompted.
- i If Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially. When Wi-Fi becomes unavailable, your phone automatically switches to the mobile data connection.

#### Using the WPS button

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- **3.** On the Wi-Fi network list, touch  $\boldsymbol{\mathcal{Z}}$  .
- **4.** On the Wi-Fi hotspot device, press the WPS button.

#### Using the WPS PIN

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (a) then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- **3.** On the Wi-Fi network list, touch **=** .
- **4.** Touch **Input WPS PIN**. Your phone generates a PIN.

# Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

Want to access the Internet from multiple devices when you are on the go? Use USB tethering or set your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot to share its data connection with other devices.

#### Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can also function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, sharing its mobile data connection.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- **4.** Name the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- **5.** Select an encryption mode.
- it is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2 PSK to better secure the Wi-Fi network.
- **6.** Set the key to the Wi-Fi hotspot.

When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered

- 7. Select the **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** check box.
- **8.** On the device you want to use, search for and connect to your phone's Wi-Fi network

#### **USB** tethering

You can share your phone's data connection with a computer using a USB cable.

To use USB tethering, you may need to install your phone's driver on the computer or establish a network connection, depending on your computer's operating system. If your computer runs Windows 7, Windows Vista, or a latest Linux operating system (such as Ubuntu 10.4), you can use your phone's USB tethering function without configuring any settings on the computer. If you are running an earlier version of Windows or another OS, your PC will identify and install a driver automatically.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 3. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 4. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- **5.** Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your phone's data connection.
- in USB storage mode.

## Controlling your data usage

Your phone's data usage control function lets you check and control your data usage. Set a data usage cycle and a mobile data limit for this period and you will be notified when data usage reaches this limit.

#### Setting your mobile data usage limits

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- 4. Select the **Set mobile data limit** check box.
- **5.** Set the data usage limits as follows:

- Drag the limit line up or down to adjust the mobile data usage limit.
- Drag the warning line up or down to adjust the mobile data usage warning value. When your data usage reaches the warning line, you will be notified.
- Drag the date lines left or right to check the data usage during a specific period of time.
- Touch **Data usage cycle** to set the statistical cycle for data usage.

#### Viewing the data usage of an application

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Flick up to view the data usage of all applications.
- **5.** Touch an application for more details.

#### Restricting the background mobile data usage

You can restrict the background mobile data usage of some or all applications to save data traffic. This function only takes effect when your phone is using a mobile data connection. When your phone is connected to a Wi-Fi network, applications run without any data restrictions.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Touch , and select the **Restrict bkgd. data** check box to restrict the background mobile data usage of all applications.
- i To restrict the background mobile data usage of a specific application, choose the application from the application list on the **Data usage** screen to display its data usage details. Then touch and select the **Restrict bkgd. data** check box.

#### Restricting automatic data synchronization

Restricting automatic data synchronization helps save data traffic and battery power. After this function is enabled, you have to manually synchronize your accounts.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.
- **4.** Touch and clear the **Auto-sync data** check box.

# **Sharing data**

#### **Bluetooth**

Your phone is Bluetooth-capable, allowing you to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices for wireless data transmission. When using Bluetooth, stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of other Bluetooth devices.

#### **Turning on Bluetooth**

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (in the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.

When Bluetooth is turned on, your phone's name is displayed at the top of the **Bluetooth** screen. Touch the name to set your phone's visibility.

i To rename your phone, touch => Rename phone. When you are done, touch Rename to save the changes.

#### Pairing with other Bluetooth devices

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, enable Bluetooth on both devices and pair them with each other.

- 1. On the home screen, touch ( ) then the **ALL** tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.
- **3.** From the list of detected Bluetooth devices, touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair with it.

To disconnect from a paired Bluetooth device, under PAIRED DEVICES, touch

if a Bluetooth connection cannot be set up between your phone and another device, they may be incompatible.

#### Sharing files using Bluetooth

Bluetooth enables you to conveniently send photos, videos, and other files to your family and friends. You can share files with Bluetooth-enabled devices without an Internet connection.

- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to send.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. From the detected Bluetooth device list, select a device.

#### Receiving files using Bluetooth

- 2. Touch Bluetooth share: Incoming file to display a file reception dialog box.
- 3. Touch Accept to start receiving the file.

When the file is received, you will receive a notification of a successful transfer. Open the notification panel to read the notification. By default, received files are saved to the **bluetooth** folder in **File Manager**.

#### Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct lets you easily connect two devices and transmit or share data between them.

#### Connecting two devices using Wi-Fi Direct

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. In the Wi-Fi network list, touch ♣ .

  You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.
- **4.** Select a device.

#### Sending a file using a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Touch and hold the file you want to send.
- **2.** From the displayed option menu, choose **Share**.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi direct.

You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.

- **4.** Touch the device you want to send the file to.
- Specific steps may vary slightly by file type.

# **Using DLNA**

The Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) aims to implement intercommunication between computers and other electronic products through wired and wireless networks, providing users with seamless digital media services. DLNA enables users on the same Wi-Fi network to share multimedia files easily. Using DLNA, you can:

- Share multimedia files with your friends.
- Access multimedia files on other DLNA devices.
- Play multimedia files on other devices and control the playback.
- i Before you use DLNA, make sure your phone and other DLNA devices are connected to the same Wi-Fi network and DLNA is enabled on all devices.

On the home screen, touch **Tools** > to access this application. You can then share photos, videos, and songs with other DLNA devices, as well as view and download the multimedia files that other DLNA devices are sharing with you.

#### **Huawei Beam**

Huawei Beam lets you quickly share data between two Near Field Communication (NFC) enabled phones. To beam a web page or contact to another phone, place the two phones back to back and touch the content.

#### Turning on Huawei Beam

- 1. On the home screen, touch other the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch the NFC switch to turn on NFC.
- 4. Touch NFC then the Huawei Beam switch to turn on Huawei Beam.

#### Sharing a web page or contact through Huawei Beam

Before you use Huawei Beam to share a web page or contact, make sure that both phones are not locked and that NFC and Huawei Beam are enabled.

- **1.** Select the web page or contact you want to share.
- **2.** Place the two phones back to back. After a connection is set up, the phones play a tone, and the web page or contact screen shrinks.
- **3.** Touch the shrunken screen to display its information on the other phone.

# Connecting your phone to a computer

When you connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable, your phone will display a notification prompting you to select a connection type.

#### MTP mode

The Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) is used to transfer media files, such as pictures, songs, and videos, between your phone and a computer. The MTP mode is only compatible with Windows Media Player 10 or later.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB computer connection** screen, choose **Media device (MTP)**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- **3.** After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

#### PTP mode


The Picture Transfer Protocol (PTP) is another method to transfer pictures and videos to your computer.

- **1.** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- On the USB computer connection screen, choose Camera (PTP).The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- **3.** After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

#### Mass storage mode

In mass storage mode, you can use your phone as a USB mass storage device and transfer files between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2.** On the **USB computer connection** screen, choose **USB storage device**. The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- **3.** The computer will identify your phone as a USB mass storage device. You can then transfer files between your phone and the computer.



# File Manager

**File Manager** helps you manage files and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card. You'll be able to view, create, edit, delete, move, archive, compress, and decompress files.

### Switching between category and list views

File Manager provides category and list views.

- Under the category view, audio clips, videos, images, and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card are displayed by category, easy for you to browse through.
- Under the list view, files in your phone's internal storage and microSD card are displayed in a list.

On the home screen, touch . Under Internal, touch to switch to the category view or touch to switch to the list view.

### Creating a folder

You can create folders to better manage the files and applications stored in your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch  $\equiv$  > New folder.
- **4.** In the displayed dialog box, name the new folder.
- 5. Touch Save.

## Searching for a file

Too many files stressing you out? The search function helps you find what you need in no time.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch  $\equiv$  > Search.
- **4.** Enter part or all of the file name.

  Matching results will be displayed.

## Copying, cutting, and pasting a file

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to copy or cut.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Copy or Cut.
- **4.** Select where you want to paste the file.
- 5. Touch Paste.

## Compressing or decompressing files

You can compress files into .zip files to save space or decompress .zip and .rar files.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you want to compress.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Compress.
- **4.** Choose the save path of the compressed file and name it.
- 5. Touch OK.

To decompress a file, touch and hold it and choose **Extract** from the displayed option menu.

## Renaming a file

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to rename.
- **3.** From the displayed option menu, choose **Rename**.
- **4.** In the displayed dialog box, enter a new name for the file.
- 5. Touch OK.

### **Deleting a file**

- 2. Touch and hold the file you want to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Delete**.
- 4. Touch OK.

## Creating a shortcut for a file or folder

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- **2.** Touch and hold the file or folder you want to create a shortcut for.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Desktop shortcuts**.

### Checking the memory status

Before you save large files to your phone's internal storage or microSD card, make sure there is enough space first.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch
- 2. Touch  $\equiv$  > Storage.
- **3.** On the **Storage settings** screen, view the total and available space on your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

# **Managing applications**

### **Downloading applications**

A rich selection of applications is available through Google's **Play Store**. You can also connect your phone to a computer and transfer applications over that way.

### Installing an application

- It is recommended that you use Play Store as your primary download source. Certain third-party applications from other sources may not be compatible with your phone.
- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > 🔝 .
- 2. Select the application you want to install.
- 3. Touch  $\equiv$  > Install.
- 4. Touch Done.
- i During the installation, an Install blocked message may be displayed. Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, touch Settings, and select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of third-party applications. Then touch ← to proceed.

### **Viewing applications**

You can view detailed information about all applications installed on your phone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to All.
- **4.** Select the application you want to view.

### **Uninstalling an application**

You can remove unwanted applications to increase your phone's available storage.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to All.
- **4.** Select the application you want to uninstall.
- 5. Touch Uninstall > OK.
- Some pre-installed applications cannot be uninstalled.

## Clearing the application cache

You can clear the application cache to free up the phone memory.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to All.
- 4. Touch Clear cache.

# **Phone Manager**

### **About Phone Manager**

Phone Manger is a system application that lets you better protect and manage your phone. Phone manger enables you to optimize the system performance by diagnosing your phone, cleaning out trash files, and more. You can also manage the access permissions of your applications to keep your personal and private data safe.

#### Phone accelerator

If you are experiencing slowdown issues with your phone, you may have too many applications using up too much memory. Optimize your system by using phone accelerator.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Mgmt.** > ①.
- 2. Touch Phone accelerator.
- **3.** Select the unwanted applications, and touch **CLOSE**.

## Storage cleaner

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Mgmt.** > **1**.
- 2. Touch Storage cleaner.
- **3.** Touch **Smart scan**, and clean your phone storage based on the scan results.
- On the **Storage cleaner** screen, touch to have your phone periodically (you set the time interval) clean the cache, thumbnails, storage, and more.

#### Harassment filter

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Mgmt**. > 🗐 .
- 2. Touch Harassment filter.
- 3. On the Harassment filter screen, you can:
  - Touch Calls or Messages to view the blocked calls or messages.
  - Touch **Blacklist** > **ADD CONTACTS** to add a number to the blacklist.

### **Power saving**

- 1. On the home screen, touch Mgmt. > 1. On the home screen, touch Mgmt. > 1.
- 2. Touch Power saving.
- **3.** On the **Power saving** screen, you can:
  - Turn off the functions not in use to save power.
  - Touch **Power monitoring** and manually optimize the power plan based on the scan results.
  - Touch Smart to enable smart mode and have your phone conserve power while still allowing full use of all phone functions.
  - Touch **Endurance** to enable endurance mode and have your phone consume the least amount of power possible.
  - Touch **Normal** to enable normal mode.

# **Notification manager**

Some applications may push all kinds of notifications to your phone. Notification manager lets you set restriction rules on notifications to avoid receiving unnecessary information.

- 1. On the home screen, touch Mgmt. > 1. On the home screen, touch Mgmt. > 1.
- 2. Flick left on the lower part of the screen, and touch Notification manager.
- 3. On the Notification manager screen, you can:
  - Touch Rules to view applications that may send notifications to the notification panel and set push rights for your applications.
  - Touch **Log** to view the blocked notifications.

### **About Google services**

To use Google services, such as emailing using Gmail, instant chatting, querying location information, watching online videos, or downloading applications from the Play Store, sign in with a Google account. If you don't have one, open a Google application and follow the onscreen instructions to create your Google account.

Google applications, services, and functions vary with country and service provider. Please follow local laws and regulations when you use Google services.

- Touch > **Forward** to forward the email.

### **Hangouts**

Hangouts is an instant chat application provided by Google. With Hangouts, you can reach your friends using messages, or voice and video chats.

- 1. On the home screen, touch Google apps >  $\psi$ .
- **2.** Touch +.
- 3. Enter the email address of your friend.
- **4.** Touch at the bottom of the screen to start messaging or touch start a video chat.

### Maps

Maps helps you find out where you are, shows you how to get to a destination, and displays real-time traffic. Satellite view is also available.

### Turning on location services

- **1.** On the home screen, touch ②.
- 2. Under All, touch Location access.
- **3.** Touch **Access my location** to let selected applications access your location information.
- **4.** Select the **GPS satellites**, **Wireless networks**, and **Use Quick GPS** check boxes.

#### Searching for places of interest

Before you use Maps to search for a location, turn on your location services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch Google apps >  $\mathbb{Z}$ .
- 2. Touch Q.

- **3.** Enter the location you want to search for.
- **4.** Touch Q in the lower right corner of the keyboard. The search results are then marked on the map by letters.
- **5.** Touch a mark to see how to get there and view more details about the location.

### Getting somewhere

- 1. On the home screen, touch Google apps > \textstyle{\textstyle{\textstyle{1}}}.

Play Store is Google's digital application distributed platform, where you can download applications and games, as well as update and browse downloaded content.

- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download and install it.

#### Uninstalling an application

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **.**
- 2. Touch  $\equiv$  > My Apps.
- 3. Select the application you want to uninstall, and touch Uninstall.
- 4. Touch OK.

## **Basic utilities**

Your phone comes with a variety of useful tools, such as **Calendar**, **Clock**, and **Calculator**, helping you keep yourself organized.

### **Backup**

**Backup** lets you back up your important data and restore them after a system upgrade or reset.

#### Backing up data to local storage

- 2. Touch Back up to SD card.
- 3. Select the data you want to back up.
- 4. Touch BACK UP.
- **5.** Enter a password when prompted.
- **6.** Select the data you want to back up, then follow the onscreen instructions to back it up.

By default, backup files are saved to the **HuaweiBackup** folder in **File** manager.

#### Restoring data from local storage

- 3. From the backup file list, choose the files you want to restore.
- 4. Enter the backup password.

#### Calendar

**Calendar** is your personal assistant that helps you manage, arrange, and keep track of all important events.

#### Creating an event

- **3.** Enter event details, such as the event name, time, and location.
- 4. Touch SAVE.

#### Viewing events

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **28**.
- Touch the date in the upper left corner to switch between the year, month, week, day, and agenda views. The agenda view displays all your calendar events.

#### Sharing an event

You can share an event with your family and friends in a number ways, such as Bluetooth.

- 3. Touch => Send event.
- **4.** Select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions.

#### Synchronizing and viewing events

Calendar events in your accounts (such as an email account) can be synchronized to and viewed on **Calendar**.

- **3.** Set the alarm time, ringtone, how often it repeats, and more.

- **2.** On the **Calculator** screen, flick left or right to switch between the basic and scientific calculators.

#### **Notes**

**Notes** is a handy application that lets you record quick thoughts or important information.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Touch Add note.
- **3.** Enter what you want to record.

- On the **Notes** screen, you can touch and select one or more notes you want to delete, or select **All** to delete all notes.

#### Weather

**Weather** provides you with the latest weather information for any city around the world. You can share weather information with your family and friends.

Before you use Weather, turn on your phone's GPS and data service.

#### Adding a city

Add cities of your concern to **Weather** to check their real-time weather information.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > .
- 2. Touch  $\equiv > +$ .
- n addition to your current city, you can add up to nine cities.
- Enter a city name.Matching cities are then displayed.
- **4.** Select the city you want to add.

#### Setting the default city

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **.** .
- **2.** Touch **≔**.
- **3.** Touch the icon next to the city you want to set as the default city.

### **Deleting cities**

- **1.** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **.**
- **2.** Touch **≔** > **\*** .
- 3. Select the cities you want to delete, and touch **DELETE**.

#### **Updating** weather

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **.** .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you want to update.
- **3.** Touch  $\mathcal{C}$  to update the weather.
- i You can also set **Weather** to automatic update mode. Touch  $\equiv$  > , select **Auto update**, and set **Update interval**. Your phone will then update the weather at the interval you set.

#### Sharing weather information

Your phone lets you send weather information as a text message to remind your family and friends of weather changes.

- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you want to share.
- **3.** Touch  $\leq$  to display the messaging screen.
- 4. You can then:
  - Enter a phone number.

#### **FM** radio

Want to listen to your favorite broadcast programs? Open **FM Radio** anytime anywhere you like.



# **Accounts and sync**

You can synchronize data on your phone, such as contacts, emails, and events, to and from the Internet.

## Adding an account

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under ACCOUNTS, touch Add account.
- **3.** Select an account type.
- **4.** Follow the onscreen instructions and enter your account information.
- **5.** Configure the account and set the type of data you want to synchronize. When an account is set up, it will be shown in the **ACCOUNTS** section.
- The types of data you can synchronize to your phone vary with account type.

## **Deleting an account**

- 1. On the home screen, touch 💿 then the All tab.
- 2. Under ACCOUNTS, select an account type.
- **3.** Select the account you want to delete.
- **4.** Touch **≡** > **Remove account**.
- **5.** In the displayed dialog box, touch **Remove account**.

## Turning on data synchronization

- 1. On the home screen, touch other the All tab.
- 2. Under ACCOUNTS, select an account type.
- **3.** Select the account you want to synchronize from.

- **4.** Touch the data you want to synchronize.
- i You can touch = > Sync now to have the data synchronization run in the background.

### Modifying account synchronization settings

- 2. Under ACCOUNTS, select an account type.
- **3.** Select the account whose synchronization settings you want to modify.
- **4.** Under **Sync settings**, select the data you want to synchronize.

# **Settings**

## Turning on or off airplane mode

Always comply with all airline rules and regulations. If allowed by the aircraft operator, you may switch on your phone and enable airplane mode in flight. In airplane mode, your phone's wireless features are disabled, but you can still listen to music or play games.

Use either of the following methods to turn on or off Airplane mode:

- Press and hold the power button. From the displayed option menu, choose
   Airplane mode.
- On the home screen, touch then the All tab. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Airplane mode.

When airplane mode is on,  $\times$  appears in the status bar.

### **Tone settings**

- 1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- **3.** From the settings screen, you can:
  - Touch Volume and drag the sliders to set the volume of music, ringtones, message tones, and more.
  - Touch **Vibration** to set whether your phone vibrates when you have an incoming call, message, email, event, and more.
  - Touch **Silent mode** to turn on or off silent mode.
  - Touch **Phone ringtone** to select a ringtone.
  - Touch **Notification tone** to select a tone for messages, emails, events, and more.

- Touch or clear the check box under **SYSTEM** to turn on or off the notification tone or vibration when you touch or lock the screen, take a screenshot, dial a number, and more.
- i You can adjust the volume from the home screen or most applications, such as call, music, and video.

### **Display settings**

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under DEVICE, touch Display.
- **3.** On the settings screen, you can:
  - Touch **Brightness** to set the screen brightness. To manually adjust the brightness, clear the **Automatic brightness** check box.
  - Touch **Wallpaper** to set the lock screen and home screen wallpapers.
  - Touch **Auto-rotate screen** to turn on or off the screen auto-rotate function. If this function is turned on, your screen's orientation will automatically change with the way you hold your phone when you perform certain operations, such as browsing a web page, viewing a picture, or writing a message.
  - Touch **Sleep** to set a screen timeout period. If idle for the specified period, your phone automatically locks its screen to save battery power.
  - Touch **Daydream** to turn on or off the screen saver. If this function is enabled, the screen saver will automatically run while your phone is being charged.
  - Touch **Font size** to change the display font size.

### Setting the date and time

By default, your phone relies on the network-based date and time. You can also manually set the date and time.

1. On the home screen, touch (a) then the All tab.

- 2. Under SYSTEM, touch Date & time.
- **3.** From the settings screen, you can:
  - Clear the **Automatic date & time** check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the network date and time.
  - Clear the Automatic time zone check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the network time zone.
  - Touch **Set date** and flick up and down to set your phone's date.
  - Touch **Set time** and flick up and down to set your phone's time.
  - Touch Select time zone and select the time zone from the list. Scroll up or down to view more time zones.
  - Select or clear the Use 24-hour format check box to switch between the 12-hour and 24-hour formats
  - Touch **Select date format** to select how you want the date to be displayed.

## Changing the system language

- **1.** On the home screen, touch (a) then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Language & input.
- 3. Touch Language.
- **4.** From the list, choose a language.

### Setting the PIN of your SIM card

The personal identification number (PIN) is delivered with your SIM card. If you enable the PIN protection function for your SIM card, you will need to enter the PIN each time you power your phone on.

Before you perform the following operations, make sure you have obtained your SIM card's PIN from your service provider.

- 1. On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.

- 3. Touch Set up SIM/USIM card lock.
- 4. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- 5. Enter the PIN.
- 6. Touch OK.



 $\Lambda$  If you incorrectly enter the PIN a specified number of consecutive times, the PIN is blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PIN unblocking key (PUK). If you incorrectly enter the PUK a specified number of consecutive times, the SIM card will be disabled permanently. For details about the maximum retry attempts for the PIN and PUK, contact your service provider.

## Restoring factory settings

Restoring your phone to its factory settings erases all your personal data from the phone, including your email accounts, system and application settings, and installed applications.



A Back up important data on your phone before you restore factory settings.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Backup & reset.
- 3. Touch Factory data reset > Reset phone > Reset phone. The phone will restore its factory settings and restart.

### Online update

Once in a while, new updates for your phone will be available online. You will receive a notification when updates are available. Before updating, make sure your phone has enough storage space for the update package.



🛕 All your personal data may be erased during a system update. It is recommended that you back up important data before updating your phone.

To update your phone manually, go to the home screen, touch > About phone > System Update > Online update to check for updates, and follow the onscreen instructions to update your phone online.

## **Accessibility**

You can turn on or off preset or installed accessibility features.

- **1.** On the home screen, touch then the **All** tab.
- 2. Under SYSTEM, touch Accessibility.
- **3.** Select the features you want to turn on or off.

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
